Rules For All Exhibitors

- Unless otherwise specified, all exhibits are open to both adults and juniors. Juniors are boys and girls 18 years of age or younger as of January 1.
- Chairpersons reserve the right to reject any or all entries. When there is only one competitor in a class, awarding prizes will be left to the discretion of the judges.
- Except where noted, first, second, and third prize ribbons will be awarded
- The Fair Committee is not responsible for loss or damage to entries.
- Everyone is welcome to enter. You do not have to be a resident of Sterling to enter an exhibit.

• Winners will be given a voucher.

- Exhibit Hall prize money will be given as cash by the Town Treasurer representative, at the Fair, 3:30 Sunday of the Fair.
- Prize winner's name, address, and amount of money will be on the voucher.
- Vouchers not cashed in at The Fair can be cashed by appointment at the Sterling Town Treasurer's Office.
- Prize money not claimed by October 31st will revert back to town.

Hall Exhibitors

- All exhibits must be made or produced by the exhibitor. Unless otherwise specified, all exhibits are open to both adults and juniors. Juniors are boys and girls 18 years of age or younger as of January 1.
- You can enter multiple exhibits, but you can only enter one exhibit per person per class.
- All exhibits must be dropped off between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Thursday, the week of the Fair.
- Exhibitors must register or risk the forfeit of prize money. Judging will take place Thursday evening & Friday morning before The Exhibit Hall opens.

How Do I Enter a Hall Exhibit?

- Browse the exhibit categories and decide which departments and classes you would like to enter. You can enter only one exhibit per class. If you have questions about entering an exhibit, call the chairperson listed for that department.
- Make, grow, raise, build, sew, or bake your entries. 3. Fill in and attach one **exhibit card** to each article. Print as many exhibit cards as needed. Extra cards will be available at the Sterling Fair on Thursday, week of the Fair, at the registration desk.
- Go to the designated area for your exhibit and leave it with an exhibitor card attached to it.
- All hall exhibits must remain in the hall until 3:30 p.m. on Sunday. **No Exceptions**. This is a Massachusetts Department of Food and Agriculture requirement.
- Pick up your exhibits on **Sunday**, Week of the Fair, between 3:30 p.m. and 4:15 p.m. Show an exhibit hall volunteer your **claim ticket**, and then remove your exhibits. All exhibits must be removed by 4:15 p.m. Any vegetables, fruits, eggs, honey, flowers, or baked goods not removed by 4:15 p.m. will be auctioned to help defray fair expenses.

- Prize money will be available Sunday at 3:30 until 5pm. The committee will assume that those who do not pick up Prize money can make an appointment with the Town of Sterling Treasurer's office.
- The committee reserves the right to reject any exhibit they feel not appropriate.

Instructions, Adult and Junior entries

- Attach one Exhibit Card to each article entered. There are 3 cards in the booklet. If you need additional cards, make copies of this page or pick up extra cards at the Sterling Town Hall, the Sterling Library, or at the Sterling Fair.
- Register in the Exhibit Hall area, get your article pickup ticket and place exhibit articles, with the exhibit card attached, at the proper exhibit tables.
- All exhibitors must register or risk forfeit of their premiums.
 Exhibit Cards must be readable and complete or risk forfeit of Premiums.
